Safe and effective COVID-19 vaccines received Emergency Use Authorization from the Food and Drug Administration in December 2020. Since then, more than 300,000 COVID-19 vaccinations have been administered to residents and staff at nearly 1,600 long-term care facilities in Illinois through the work of the Federal Pharmacy Partnership Program, Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), and local health departments. Similar programs ensuring the vulnerable residents of long-term care facilities receive COVID-19 vaccinations have been offered in every state.

Encouraged by the decline of COVID-19 cases across the country, and the availability of vaccines, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), in conjunction with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), released expanded nursing home visitation guidance on March 10, 2021 (QSO-20-39-NH revised). Separation from family and other loved ones has taken a physical and emotional toll on residents, and the revised guidance is a step towards reducing that burden.

Continuing to take precautions to reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19, however, remains vitally important. At this time, not all nursing home residents and staff are fully vaccinated making it possible for them to still become infected by visitors. In addition, the CDC and public health experts are evaluating if individuals can spread COVID-19, including new variants, even if they are vaccinated.

Therefore, the CDC still recommends maintaining the infection prevention practices that reduce the spread of COVID-19, such as wearing a face mask, performing hand hygiene, and maintaining 6 feet of physical distance from others.

Detailed within this edition is information pertaining to how these new changes will be implemented at Sunny Hill Nursing Home and impact day-to-day visitation affecting residents and their families.

#### ADMINISTRATOR'S CORNER

Dear Residents, Family Members and Community Friends,

Happy Easter and Happy Spring to all! Despite some recent setbacks regarding visitation, activities, dining and beauty shop we are ready to keep our heads pointed toward the sun and our feet moving forward. Sunny Hill has had to press the "pause" button related to visits, activities, dining, and the beauty shop. Testing for residents and staff will continue weekly for a minimum of 14 days without a positive Covid-19 case. Sunny Hill is anticipating reopening and resuming visitation, dining room dining, activities and beauty shop on or about April 15<sup>th</sup>, depending on testing results in the meantime.

Now that the weather is warming up and we can enjoy those rays of sunshine the outdoor tent "Hut Heaven" has been relocated to the lower level Courtyard patio area. This allows the Sunshine Room patio to be available for residents to come and go freely through the door without interruption. Visitation once resumed can occur in the tent area, and all three patios. Window and virtual visits continue with Life Engagement coordinating the process and Compassionate Care visits can occur at any time as scheduled with Social Services.

Sunny Hill's annual Licensure and Certification Survey occurred on March 15<sup>th</sup> for four days with five Surveyors from Illinois Department of Public Health. Subsequently, Life Safety and Emergency Preparedness Survey occurred for two days on March 23<sup>rd</sup>. Overall, the final outcome was positive in nature from all areas surveyed.

An additional vaccination clinic was held at Sunny Hill this week by our pharmacy provider and new residents who admitted were able to obtain their vaccination as well as additional staff members who had signed up. This clinic will occur biweekly for residents and staff and multiple staff have already registered for the upcoming clinic. Staff interest has increased as our pharmacy is administering the Moderna vaccine which is only one shot.

Essential Care Giver Program: NEW Person Centered Program is drafted and endorsed by Illinois Department of Public Health. Family member designated and involved will not be considered a "visitor" but someone essential to care delivery and residents well-being. This program will allow family members/other to assist resident directly. Training, coordination, and a contract is required. Will be assigning an Essential Care Giver Coordinator to assist with all aspects of this upcoming roll out but much groundwork and preparation is still needed. This program was placed on "hold" when Sunny Hill reopened on March 11<sup>th</sup>, however, having reevaluating the need, currently looking to continue to introduce this program based on potential outbreak situations. If essential caregivers are established regardless of Sunny Hills outbreak situation certain designated family members can still visit and be with their loved ones. More information to come in the

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# At a glance, thíngs to remember...regarding in person & exterior visitation (rev. 3/10/2021)

- The information contained in this outline supersedes and replaces previously issued guidance and recommendations regarding visitation.
- CMS in conjunction with CDC is emphasizing the importance of maintaining infection prevention practices, given the continued risk of Covid-19 transmission particularly in congregate care settings.
- Outline includes combined CMS/CDC guidelines as well as facility specific guidelines.
- Recognizing the effects of physical and social separation of residents from loved ones and the emotional toll this has exerted in many ways has necessitated an adjustment in visitation due to the effectiveness and overall impact of Covid-19 vaccination in Nursing Homes.
- Regardless of how visits are conducted there are certain core principles and best practices that must be adhered to at all times as follows:
- Screening, Hand hygiene, Face covering, Physical distancing, Signage posted, Cleaning & disinfecting, Use of PPE, Cohorting residents, and testing residents/staff per protocol and testing strategy plan
- Visitation will be person centered, considering the residents physical, mental and psychosocial well-being and support quality of life.
- Visitation will occur with provision of adequate degree of privacy
- Visitors who are unable to adhere to the core principles of Covid-19 infection prevention will not be permitted to visit or will be asked to leave.

- Outdoor visitation is still preferred even if both parties are <u>fully vaccinated</u> against Covid-19
  as outdoor visits generally pose a lower risk of transmission due to increased space and airflow.
- Facility has accessible and safe outdoor spaces for visitation, on the Sunshine and 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue patios as well as the lower level Courtyard. In addition, there is a tent "Hut Heaven" with propane heating and blankets from the blanket warmer available on the Sunshine patio.
- <u>Fully vaccinated</u> refers to a person who is  $\geq 2$  weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2- dose series, or  $\geq 2$  weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine, per the CDC's Public Health Recommendations for Vaccinated Persons.
- Indoor visitation is allowed at all times and for all residents regardless of vaccination status except for a few circumstances as follows: Unvaccinated residents, if the nursing home's COVID-19 county positivity rate is >10% and <70% of residents in the facility are fully vaccinated, residents with confirmed Covid-19 infection and residents in quarantine.
- Facilities can consider scheduling visits for a specified length of time, however SH will not be doing this as we have a large building footprint and ample space to accommodate visitation and still comply with the core principles of infection prevention
- Sunny Hill is limiting visitor movement in the facility as recommended and visitors should go directly to the resident's room or designated visitation area and not walk around different halls of the facility.
- While acknowledging the toll separation and isolation has taken there is no substitute for physical contact such as a warm embrace between a resident and their loved one.
- Therefore, if the resident is fully vaccinated, they can choose to have close contact (including touch) with their visitor while wearing a well-fitting face mask and performing hand-hygiene before and after. Regardless, visitors should physically distance from other residents and staff in the facility.
- Compassionate care visitation is permitted at all times and coordinated by Social Services if needed for any situation
- Indoor visitation may continue even in outbreak situations, however there are certain prerequisites to be fulfilled. To swiftly detect prevalence and positive cases facilities must adhere to CMS regulations and guidance for Covid-19 testing, including routine staff testing, testing of individuals with symptoms and outbreak testing.
- In all cases visitors will be notified about the Covid-19 exposure occurrences in the facility and outbreak status via emergency Call Em All system.
- Sunny Hill encourages visitors to become vaccinated when they have the opportunity but visitors are not required to be tested or vaccinated.
- Federal and State surveyors, ombudsman are not required to be vaccinated and must be permitted entry to facilities unless they exhibit signs or symptoms of Covid-19.

These approaches and expectations are critical to maintaining ongoing resident, family and staff safety.

# WHEN CAN I VISIT HER NURSING HOME?

It is so great that your mom, dad or other loved ones have received their COVID-19 vaccine. This is an important step towards protecting their health, achieving herd immunity and returning to normal life.

Both CMS and CDC recognize the importance of visiting your relatives as part of staying healthy. You can now visit your loved ones inside when the positivity rate in your nursing home's county is less than 10%. In addition, if the positivity rate in your nursing home's county is more than 10%, and less than 70% of residents in the facility are fully vaccinated, then only residents who are fully vaccinated should receive visitors.

In the case of an outbreak at a facility, indoor visitation is still possible, as long as COVID-19 transmission is contained to a single area of the facility.

If your loved one is fully vaccinated, they can choose to have close contact (including touch) with you as long as they are wearing a well-fitting face mask.

Outdoor visits are also safer when weather is good. You can check with your nursing home or local health department to find out more information on visiting your loved one. More information on CMS' visitation guidance can be found **here**, including compassionate care visits and visitor vaccination.

We are constantly weighing the risks of spreading COVID-19 with the risks of expanding visitation. There are a few more steps before nursing homes can allow even more visitors.

Some nursing home residents and staff are not vaccinated or haven't received their second doses. **So, not everyone in a nursing home is protected from COVID-19 yet and could be infected by visitors.** 

Also, although a vaccinated person may not "feel" sick from COVID-19, they could be infected and/or spread the virus to others. For example, if a vaccinated resident contracts the virus from a staff member or visitor, that resident will likely be protected from the disease, but could put an unvaccinated resident or staff member at serious risk.

For now, nursing home staff, patients, residents, and visitors need to continue practicing the 3 W's: Wear a mask, Wash your hands, Watch your distance. And, nursing homes must continue to implement all current CDC infection control guidance and adhere to CMS' regulations and guidance for testing. As vaccination increases and COVID-19 cases decrease, we look forward to more visitation and social interaction among residents, friends, family, and lovedones. We will continue to learn and make updates to visitation over the coming months.

So what can you do in the meantime? Get the vaccine when it's available to you. And do what you can to slow the spread of COVID-19. If you are vaccinated, then if asked, explain why you chose to be vaccinated.

The sooner we have more people vaccinated and fewer people getting sick, the sooner we can visit and hug the nursing home residents we love.
